Introducing George Kahn:

George Kahn is a Public-Interest Lawyer (PIL) and Director of Richard Spoor Inc. Attorneys (RSI), focusing on industrial human rights with a specialisation in health and safety law (and compensation aspects that form the other side of that legal area).

Kahn read towards science and social sciences at the University Of Cape Town, the humanities and law at Rhodes University, and advanced legal subjects like advanced administrative law and international human rights business law at the University of the Witwatersrand. He has been involved in numerous precedent setting matters for health and safety in the last decade.

Kahn has lectured on occupational health and safety law (and its compensation aspects) in numerous forums, including to mines, unions, occupational medical practitioners, hygienists, lawyers, academics and health activists. Kahn has advised numerous entities on health and safety, including mines, companies, national departments, unions, NGOs, and the NIOH. Prof P Benjamin has requested his assistance in updating the Juta Commentary on OHS & COIDA, and the Department of Justice has recently mooted the idea of him acting in some High Court matters that deal with these issues.

Kahn currently resides in White River with his partner Rochelle, and their three dachshunds, Charles, Robert and Darwin (named after the biologist).
